

Los Cuatro Amigos (The Four Friends)

6. Animals on show

Prior Knowledge: It is helpful if children are familiar with some key story phrases

<p><u>Objectives</u></p> <p>Listen attentively to simple spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.</p> <p>Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases</p> <p>Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language</p>	<p><u>Support</u></p> <p>Less confident children will need practice in remembering to watch and follow the leader.</p> <p><u>Extension</u></p> <p>Consider how e.g. expression and intonation can bring the performance alive.</p>	<p><u>Main</u></p> <p>Revise and rehearse the following lines for each group to chorus in preparation for the performance of the story.</p> <p><i>¡Qué manzana tan roja y bonita!</i> <i>¡Me gustaría comer esta manzana tan roja y bonita !</i> <i>Voy a buscar a mi amigo (a)</i></p> <p><i>¡Pom ! ¡Pom ! ¡Pom !</i></p> <p><i>¿Quién es ?</i> <i>Ven a ayudarme, por favor.</i></p> <p><i>Los dos amigos vuelven juntos al manzano.</i> <i>¡Ñam, ñam, ñam!</i></p> <p><u>ICT Opportunities:</u> Create a podcast of key story phrases to practise choral speaking.</p> <p>Select four children to take on the role of one of the animals. They will mime their animal's part of the story. The teacher takes the role of narrator.</p> <p>Practise putting together the teacher narrative, choral speaking and actors.</p> <p><u>ICT Opportunities:</u> Take digital photos of children freeze framing the story. Use photos to create a photo story.</p> <p>Identify four confident children as group leaders who will cue in the rest. Less confident children will need practice in remembering to watch and follow the leader.</p>

<p><u>Teaching Tips</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparation for the class performance is best done in a hall or other large space • Video a rehearsal of children acting out the story. Watch the video and evaluate. • The class could present the story to another class or as part of a whole school assembly.
